Correction- Marriage Licenses

It has been reported to us by a member of the family that the marriage license 1725 should read Amos Godfrey and Lydia Harriman. It underscores the difficulty of reading old manuscripts. It was recorded as Lydia Hanaman in the DAR record of marriages. I had someone else look at the court record and if you don't know what you should be reading you, will read it Hanaman. Thanks for the correction.

Now for other problems. March 17, 1880, the Marysville Tribune started listing a review of Union County marriages each week, at first two years at a time, later 6 months at a time. A few weeks later Eliphaz Burnham and others started pointing out errors and omissions in the record.

Omissions; Zelinda Burnham and J. C. Miller were married May 1821

Jacob Burnham and Eliza Meacham were married March 1823

A. A. Woodworth and Hila Reynolds were married April 1832

David Burnham's second marriage with Elizabeth McDonald

MURDERS IN UNION COUNTY

The Aug. 21, 1901 Union County Tribune lists the murders which had occurred in Union county as follows:

1. Union township in the 20's. Two persons quarreled over wages. One beheaded the other with a corn cutter. The murderer fled.
2. Marysville 1834. David Thornton, a tailor who worked for his father brought a young woman as his wife. The belling became noisy, the bridegroom shot into the crowd, killed a bystander. He was sent to the Penitentiary for several years, then pardoned if he would not return to Union county.
3. Six year old daughter of Parley Draper was murdered by Joseph Triplet who lived with her father. The jury found him guilty of murder; he was sentenced to be hung, but sentence was changed to Penitentiary. He died in the 70's declaring innocence.
4. May 9, 1863 Negro Cordell white who was stealing chickens from Patrick Connelly was accidentally shot by Connelly who shot in the direction of the noise. Connelly was acquitted.
5. William Freet died Apr. 13, 1863 from poison which had been administered by someone. Lathrop Converse and Mrs. Freet were arrested. The juries found neither not guilty. The case cost the county \$1183.30.
6. On April 14, 1873 a young woman, age 22, Helen Artz murdered her child, 8 days old. There were prints around the child's neck. Jury found her not guilty.
7. Oct. 1873 John Reed and a young man by name of Griffin became involved in a quarrel. Reed stabbed Griffin with a pocket knife. Reed spent some time in prison "returned to Union county and lived an honorable life until death."
8. Mar.19, 1879 John Phipps last his life at the hands of A. Elliott. Elliott served imprisonment, by labor of his sister, he later lived a worthy life. 9,10,11. Maria Scott, Ophelia Clark, an aunt, 90, and a boy named Charles Good, the whole family was murdered. Robert Garnes, a tenant spent time in prison, still there in August 1901
12. William Wilcox "butchered his wife". He committed suicide later. No date
13. May 25, 1888 George Argo killed his sister-in-law to get possession of property left to her by her mother. He put the body in water to make it appear she had drowned. He was convicted and sentenced for 20 years. He died in prison.
14. Nov. 28, 1883 David Teets killed by Isaac White near Pharisburg. White confessed the killing, spent time in prison, later paroled.
15. About 1886. Edward Powers was killed by Thomas Smith. During a political argument, Smith struck Powers with a chair. He served in prison a short time, then paroled.
16. Jan. 1890. Ellis Miller shot his sister-in-law while in a crazy condition from whiskey. He was convicted and hung for the deed.

GOWAN'S GUARDS

On the evening of the 24th day of April, 1861, in response to the call for the first 75,000 volunteers, a war meeting was held in the old Seceder Church at New California. Patriotic speeches were made by many of the old citizens, and among others the Rev. B. D. Evans and Llewellyn Curry. Volunteers were called for, and the first young man to enroll his name and offer his services was David O. Taylor, who soon after joined the Thirteenth Ohio Regiment, and, after serving his county three years with honor, was killed on the battle-field of Dallas on the 27th of May, 1864. About forty of the young men of the neighborhood volunteered that evening and in a few days an election was held for officers of the company, and James Cutler was elected Captain; W. L. Curry, First Lieutenant, and D. R. Cone, Second Lieutenant.

Among the first to volunteer was Walter Gowans, a patriotic old Scotchman upward of sixty years of age, and in honor to him the company was named the "Gowans' Guards." The company began drilling immediately at New California. The busy hands of mothers and sisters in a few days furnished uniforms, consisting of red jackets and black caps. The young ladies of the neighborhood made a large silk flag, which was presented to the company.

The company soon numbered about sixty volunteers, but before it was recruited to the required number to enter the service, the call was made for three years troops, and many of the boys becoming impatient to be off for the seat of war, began to enlist in companies that were being recruited more rapidly in the larger towns. The organization never entered the service, as their ranks were rapidly decimated by these enlistments in other organizations. All but two or three of this company soon enlisted and seventeen of them died in the service.

A complete roll of the company cannot be found, but by consulting members of the company the majority of the names have been obtained. Those with a star attached died in service.

The young men of Jerome Township rallied to every call made during the war, and her quota was always filled. No draft was ever made in the township. Soldiers' families were well cared for by the old citizens at home, and about \$10,000 were paid during the last years of the war as local bounty to recruits. The first call on Jerome Township for volunteers was for fourteen men, and the first money paid was by Thomas Jones, who paid \$70, giving each of the boys \$5. They went without bounty. Squire S. B. Woodburn was particularly active in raising money to pay bounties and save the township from the draft, and it was to him that the citizens looked for aid when calls were made for troops. He repeatedly advanced the means to pay bounties. When the last call for troops was made, it became necessary for Jerome to furnish about \$6,000 to fill her quota of men. Attempts were made to raise the amount, but they failed, and as a last resort Squire Woodburn was appointed to assess the amount. At that meeting, he assessed ten men \$200 each and advanced \$4,000.

No township in the county has a better record than Jerome. More than 340 of her citizens entered the service, and sixty-nine of them were killed or died in the army.

Union Township--Schools

Just what year the first school was started is at this distant day difficult to ascertain. But it is believed

that in the Reed settlement a school was taught as early as 1806-08. Some of the first teachers were David Chapman, Jephtha Peaseley, Ralph Phelps and Thomas Crafty.

It is probable that the next school started was in the "Green Settlement," on the post road. The first school taught here was by Nehemiah Sabine, in the winter of 1814. Other teachers, who followed Mr. Sabine, were Henry Mathews, Levi Phelps and William Burnham. This settlement was made of of New England people, and they established the first free school in the township. As the settlements increase these early schools were multiplied, until, in the spring of 1826, the township was officially divided into school districts, as follows:

"On March 24, 1826, the Trustees of Union Township met for the purpose of dividing the township into school districts, and have divided the township into six districts: No. 1, embraced the following heads of families: William Gabriel, Sylvester Phelps, William Porter, John Mitchel, Samuel Jamison, B. In 1880-81, there was erected at Milford Center a large brick schoolhouse, with slate roof, containing four rooms, and nicely furnished throughout, at a cost of about \$10,000. Three teachers are here employed, occupying three rooms; the fourth room being reserved for a high school. Also, at Irwin, a fine brick house, with slate roof, has been erected, in gothic style, finely furnished, and costing over \$6,000.
