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THE LAST SAD RITES (The Richwood Gazetter, November 23, 1893, submitted by Elaine Chapman)

Another of our quiet citizens has crossed the silent river of death. Jesse Chapman, after a few days illness, departed this life at his home in Beem's Addition, November 15, aged 58 yrs, 5ms, 5ds. He was born at Upper Sandusky, OH and when about 4 years of age, his parents moved to Essex, where he grew to manhood, but had been a resident of Richwood for about 20 years.

The deceased was a soldier in the 31st OVI from the beginning to the end of the war. He was not only brave but bold and fearless with his bravery. At one time he acted as a spy and went over the lines and through the rebel army in and about Corinth and then reported back to Gen. Hallock. Such work could only be entrusted to the bravest and best of men.

If the deceased had lived in the days of Boone and Kenton he would gladly have joined them in their deeds of daring and would have been an equal to either in Physical endurance as well as in that kind of sagacity and cunning that enabled them to out wit and evade the Indians.

When Weston was on his great walk from New York to Chicago and had promised to walk a hundred miles in twenty-four hours, the deceased started from Lima and walked to Essex and back to Lima inside of twenty four hours, making 104 miles in a day and night. Such men as Boone, Kenton and Chapman will be seen no more in this land of ours. They were pioneers as well as many of our fathers and to them we owe a debt of gratitude. Let us pay it to the living by being kind, generous and true to those for whom they toiled, suffered, fought and died.

That Jesse Chapman was respected by his neighbors and comrades in arms was shown by the care and attention given to every detail at his funeral and burial. Four of his own bunkmates carried his body to the grave and assisted by others, read the burial services of the GAR and performed the last sad duty of respect to a good man; a kind husband and father as well as a true patriot, a brave soldier, and defender of the flag and country he loved better than he did his own life. A widow and six sons are left to follow on to the great hereafter. (Buried Cheney Cemetery.)

## MARYSVILLE TRIBUNE

On March 18, 1880 the Marysville Tribune started copying the names of persons married in Union County, from the earliest court records. The paper was published once a week. At first, the marriages for 2 or 3 years were listed, later, one year each week, and finally a part of a year.

After a period of time, letters to the editor began to arrive, stating that certain marriages were omitted, as follows:

John McDowell says his marriage to Polly Porter in 1835 was missed.

Robert Graham says he was married by William Richey, not A. Amrine. May 12, 1880. My oldest sister Zelinda and J. C. Miller, Sr. were married May 1821. My brother Jacob and Eliza Meacham in March 1823; our old friend and neighbor A. A. Woodworth and Hila Reynolds in April 1832. David Burnham's second marriage with Elizabeth McDonald is omitted--perhaps 1831 or 1832.

Leonard Bliss and Lovisa Spohn, I think in 1835.

General W. B. Irwin's daughter, Gratia, is represented to have married William Sager, whereas it was William Sayer.

Prudence Williams is represented to have married Hollis Strong. She married Hollis Amy. The Editor said the above are missing from the records.

Charles M. Brooks stated we married him to the wrong woman in 1837. Should be Charles M. Brooks and Susanna F. Bennett by James Herd J. P.

DISCIPLES CHURCH, on Mill Creek, was organized by Rev. D. H. Hathaway, in the winter of 1838, with the following constituent members: Andrew Henderson and wife Sarah, James Henderson and wife Elizabeth, Charles Burr and wife Mary, Jonathan Bennington and wife, and daughter Margaret, Robert Ramsey and wife, John Ramsey and wife, A. H. Thompson and wife Harriet, Joseph Phifer and wife Charity, and Rev. D. H. Hathaway and wife. Rachel, and probably a few others, with Andrew Henderson and Charles Burr as Elders; James Henderson and Isaiah Ray as Deacons. The organization was completed in the schoolhouse near where the church now stands. They continued to hold meeting in private houses and in the schoolhouses till about 1847, when they erected a hewed-log building about 28 x 24 feet for church purposes, which was duly dedicated by Rev. Jacob Reed. This house served the people till the building of the present one, in 1859, at a cost of \$1,200, and the same was dedicated January 29, 1860, by Huston January, since which time they have had preaching once every month to the present, and social meetings on every Sabbath day. The following pastors have administered to this society since its organization: Rev. D. H. Hathaway, Arthur Criffield, William Dowling, Sr., Joh Ferguson, Jesse Ferguson, Jacob Reed, George McCaul, John Reed, Mr. Lieurance, David Mitchell, Joshua Antrim, Michael Riddle, William Pinkerton, Mr. Peterman, A. J. Clark, John Stanard, J. J. Moss, George Morse, Alonzo Skidmore, and Rev. M. C. Gallier. The present membership is about 100 with Daniel Skidmore, Lemuel Ballinger, D. H. Henderson, James Henderson and Isaac Shirk as Elders: and Thomas Garwood, D. S. Argo and George Holloway as Deacons. A good Sabbath school is held here, which was organized here 25 years or more ago, and has been continued through the summer seasons.

- 35 mm camera with film and flash.
- Notepad and pen
- For cleaning the stone: Nylon-bristled brush, rags and a sprayer filled with vinegar and water (half and half)
- For bringing out the inscription: Jumbo-sized chalk and/or shaving cream and squeegee.
- For making rubbings: non-fusible interfacing, scissors, masking tape, and jumbo-size crayons.
- Garden shears to cut away overgrown grass around the stone and a gardening pad to kneel on, Buq repellent, sun screen.

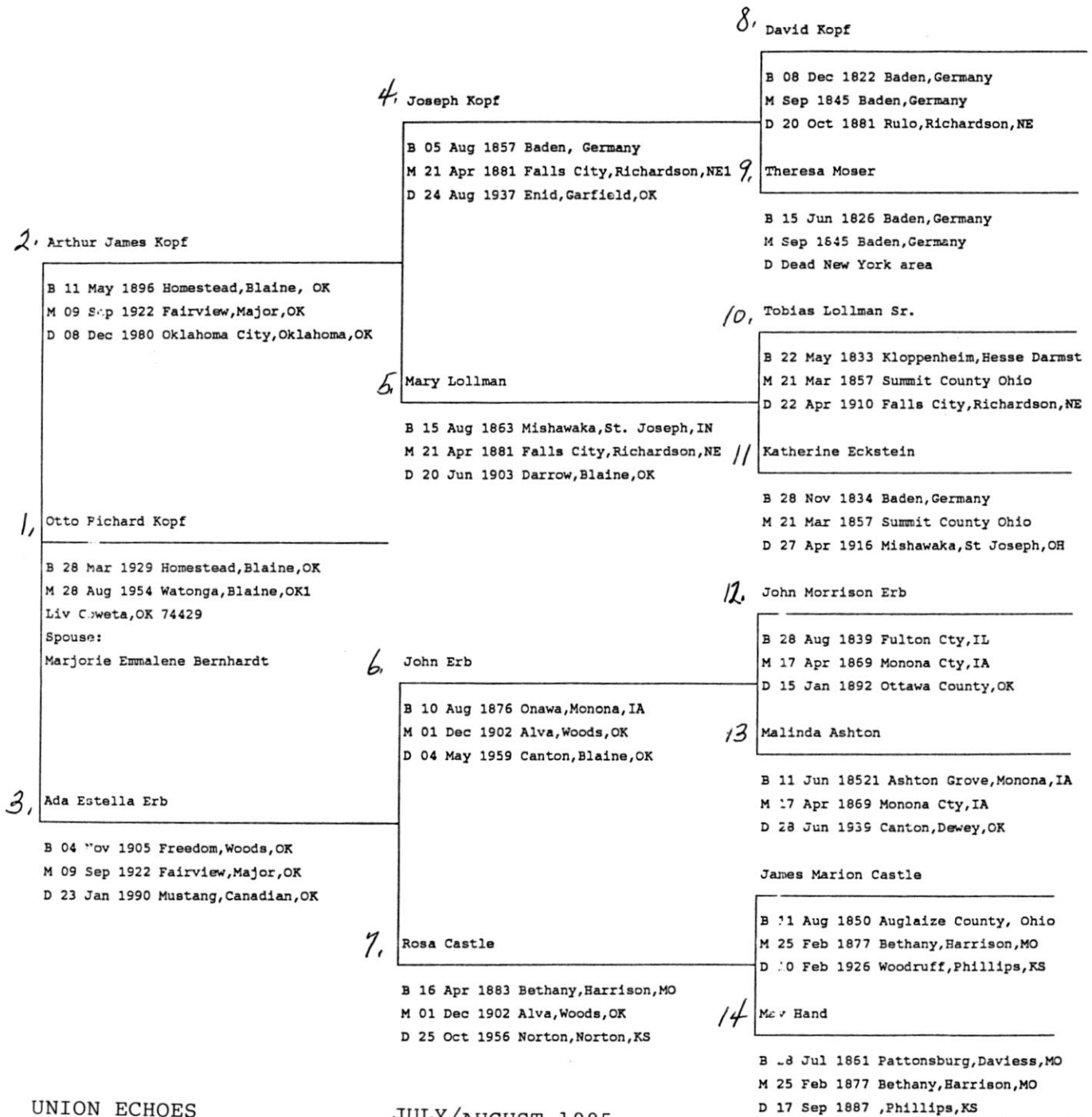
