"The speaker, Dr. Greg Rose, a professor of geography at the Marion branch of OSU spoke on Early Settlers." especially Union County with influence of being VMS (Virginia Military Survey)

"By the time of the 1850 census there were two million people in Ohio and 67% had been born in Ohio. Dr. Rose illustrated his talk with numerous maps and diagrams on overhead transparencies. "He used the 1850 census to extract data of where every person listed was born. Obvious routes to Ohio would be Lake Erie, the Ohio River, or the National Road which had been completed(cont)

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE: across the state. The Western *Reserve* along the lake would *have* been a likely destination for settlers from New England, and the Virginia Military Survey settlers did have a high percentage of Virginians, which then included the present West Virginia. The data for places of origin did show that few started out from the Tidewater, the lowland parts of Virginia nearest the sea. The Virginians tended to come from the Shenandoah or mountain areas, and some from Maryland or Pennsylvania. Some of the thousands of German settlers who disembarked at Philadelphia moved westward across PA even in colonial days. From Pittsburg some still continued west, others came down the Ohio River and made Cincinnati their home.

"Every dot on these maps could represent an ancestor for modern Ohioans, and could be helpful in our search for where our ancestors were, on their way to Ohio or to points further west."

Thanks Mary! By 1831 as many as a thousand immigrants a day passed through Buffalo, N. Y., bound for Ohio and beyond, by way of the N. Y. canal boats. The National Road entered Ohio in Belmont Co. in 1825, ran thru Guernsey Co., and reached Columbus in 1833. It is our old route #40, continues westward to this day, and thousands of early settlers traveled on it.

IMMIGRATION RECORDS
From National Archives and
Records Administration. I.
Immigration Records, more
popularly known as "ship
passenger arrival records,"
may provide evidence of a
person's arrival in the United
States, as well as foreign
birthplace. The NARA has
immigration records for
various ports for the years
1820-1957.

11. 1820-1957

Early records relating to
immigration originated in
regional customhouses. The U.
S. Customs Service conducted
its business by designating
collection districts. Each district
had a headquarters port with a
customhouse and a collector of
customs, the chief officer of the
district.

An act of March 2, 1819 (3
Stat. 489) required the captain
or master of a vessel arriving at
a port in the U. S. Or any of its
territories from a foreign
country to submit a list of
passengers to the collector of
customs. The act also required
that the collector submit a
quarterly report or abstract,
consisting of copies of these
passenger lists, to the Secretary
of State, who was required to
submit such information at each
session of Congress. After
1874, collectors forwarded only
statistical reports to the
Treasury Dept. The lists

themselves were retained by the
collector of customs. Customs
records were maintained
primarily for statistical
purposes.

On August 3, 1882, Congress
passed the first Federal law
regulating immigration (22 Stat.
214-215); the Secretary of the
Treasury had general
supervision over it between
1882 and 1891. The Office of
Sept. Of Immigration in the
Dept. Of the Treasury was
established under an act of
March 3, 1891 (26 Stat. 1085),
and was later designated a
bureau in 1895 with
responsibility for administering
the alien contract-labor laws. In
1900 administration of the
Chinese-exclusion laws was
added.

Initially the Bureau retained the
same administrative structure of
ports of entry that the Customs
Service had used. By the turn of
the century it began to designate
its own immigration districts,
the numbers and boundaries of
which changed over the years.

In 1903 the Bureau became
part of the Department of
Commerce and Labor, its name
was changed to the Bureau of
Immigration and Naturalization
when functions relating to
naturalizationwere added in
1906. In 1933 the functions
were transferred to the
Department of Labor and
became the responsibility of the
newly formed Immigration and
Naturalization Service (INS).
Under President Roosevelt's
Reorganization Plan V or 1940,
the INS was moved to the Dept.
Of Justice.

IV WHERE TO FIND THESE RECORDS:

Washington, D. C.: You may do research in immigration records in person at the National Archives Building, 700 Pennsylvania Avenue, NW, Washington, D. C. 20408-0001. Go to Room 400, the Microfilm Reading Room. Staff is available there to answer your questions. NARA microfilm publications may be examined

during regular research room hours in Room 400; no prior arrangement is necessary.

Researchers coming from a distance may wish to call in advance of their visit (1) to verify research room hours and (2) to have any additional questions answered. The Consultant's Office can be reached at 202-5015400.

Regional Records Services

Facilities: Some NARA regional records services facilities have selected immigration records; call to verify their availability.

Libraries: Libraries with *large* genealogical collections also have selected immigration records. **To obtain immigration records by mail: Paper copies** of immigration records can be ordered by mail using one NATF Form 81 for **each person or family group traveling together.**

You can obtain the NATF form 81 (limit 6 per order) by providing your name and mailing address to inquire@nara.gov. Be sure to specify "Form 81" and the number of forms you need. You can also obtain the form (6 per order) by writing to: NARA, Attn:
