

Nancy is at the Marysville Public Library on Tuesdays from 10 am to 3 pm to help all comers. The library will NOT be open until further notice.

If you have some extra time on your hands since we are stuck at home during this Coronavirus, stay at your home recommendation. Take the time to go through your pictures and put names and dates on them. I have 50 years of pictures scattered in different locations. Most of our pictures we had doubles made when developed by mail. I am sorting them and giving each of my two children a copy. I went through their 13 yrs of school pictures and put them in grade order and gave each one a copy of theirs and their siblings. Kind of fun looking through the years and seeing the homemade clothes and haircuts.

Be sure you get the parents and grandparents to put names and dates on the back of their pictures also before it's too late. So many of us inherit the old photographs, and there is no one to ask who's that person in the picture.

DO NOT write on the back of pictures with an ink pen. It will indent into the image if you push too hard. Instead, use an acid-free craft marker. The particular one I use is **ZIG** Millennium, Pigment ink, Acid-Free, Archival quality, Lightfast, Waterproof, Fade proof, Non-bleeding

Don't forget to put the old pictures on your family tree on Ancestry or Family Search. Others will enjoy them and may contact you because it's a picture they have not seen. I had someone contact me and thank me for posting a photo. She did not have any photos of that relative.

Did you know?

The 1918 influenza was a severe pandemic. An H1N1 virus caused it. It spread worldwide from 1918-1919.

The estimate was about 500 million people, or one-third of the world's population became infected with this virus. The number of deaths was estimated to be at least 50 million worldwide, with about 675,000 occurring in the United States. Mortality was high in people younger than 5 years old, 20-40 years old, and 65 years and older. The high mortality in healthy people was a unique feature of this pandemic. The properties that made it so devastating are not well understood. There was no vaccine to protect against influenza infection and no antibiotics to treat secondary bacterial infections that could be associated with influenza infections. Control efforts worldwide were limited to non-pharmaceutical interventions such as isolation, quarantine, good personal hygiene, use of disinfectants, and limitations of public gatherings, which were applied unevenly.


