Theresa Markam, Union County Recorder
Speaker at the April Meeting

Teresa Markam is a native of Richwood, Ohio. She has worked in Union county for 10 years, 8 1/2 years in the Recorder's Office.

In her office there are records from the 1820's to current on land documents and military discharge records. In 1936, a 4 year term was started. Union County has had 28 recorders since 1820. The deeds from 1800 to 2001 are indexed in books by the grantor (the person selling the property), and by the grantee (the person's receiving the property).

Teresa passed out a packet of information that detailed how you can search for a property or learn more about the property you may have. Very early documents were hand written, and after the typewriter was patented they were typed. After a property was recorded, it would be indexed by

the book volume and page number. From 1950 - 1954 the index was broken down further with number of acres, Virginia Military Survey, Lot number and town or township. Before

1995 the deeds were indexed separately by type.

After 1995 they are all indexed together. Records

from 1995 are now available online at their website: www.co.union.oh.us./Recorder/recorder.html.

All of the records in Union County Recorder's office can be photocopied. If you photocopy yourself, the cost is \$.25 per page, but if they make the copies it is \$2.00 a page. Also, there is a card file listing the veteran's buried in Union County.

About once a month I forward a message about the up coming meeting. This message is a reminder to those who regularly attend our meetings; it also serves as a notice to others who may be visiting from afar. Minutes from the Union County Chapter of the Ohio Genealogical Society

April 19, 2005

The Union County Chapter of the Ohio Genealogical

Society held the April 19th meeting in the meeting room of the **Richwood North Union Public Library**.

President Rev. John Gray called the meeting to order. Judy Lawlar, director of the Library, welcomed everyone and gave a tour of their newly renovated facility before our regular meeting.

The meeting room we used holds 75 - 85 people and if you have need of their kitchen there is a \$50 deposit, refunded if everything is left as found.

They have had two expansion projects, the latest being dedicated on September 25, 2004. This last expansion included the purchase of the Bill Rose Ford building and lot. The newly renovated space includes a wonderful reading room with lots of open space and windows, which had previously been the show room of the dealership. They have an enclosed genealogy room and their microfilms include census records of surrounding counties and Muskingum and Ross counties. Also, all of the Richwood Gazette's are on microfilm too. There is an audio room, which includes DVD and VHS tapes. A bright and beautiful children's book area is included too. They have room to grow in their main library part. Ms. Lawlar was proud to say that in her 24 years that they have never had to ask the taxpayers for a levy. With the last renovation they were able to purchase the Ford dealership building and lot with furnishings and got a loan for the renovations.

Marie Bouic read the minutes from the March 15 meeting and they were approved as read. Marian Cowgill gave the treasurer's report with a beginning balance in the checking account of February 28, 2005 of \$3,878.40. Expenses for March were \$343.33 and Income was \$462.30, leaving a balance of \$3,997.37 for March 31, 2005. The overall balance for all accounts was \$16,482.35. The report was accepted as read.

Rev. Gray announced that our Pioneer Banquet will be May 17 at the Der Dutchman Restaurant with speaker Jana Broglin speaking on her topic of 'A Boy Named Sue.' We had also received a packet of information from the Ohio Historical Society of their revised hours. They are open on Wednesday's from 9am - 5pm, Thursday, 1-9pm and Saturday from 9am to 5 pm. He also thanked Nancy for fixing the obituaries on 3x5 cards and putting them in the cabinet.

Elinor Adams has filled one book order to California and has 3 more orders to fill.

Nancy Katzenbach, librarian, thanked the society for paying her registration to the State OGS meetings. She attended with her mother, Ruth Stewart, on Thursday evening, all day Friday, and part of the day on Saturday. She said it was hard to pick which topics to attend and really enjoyed the opportunity. Virginia Smith, our Vice President, also attended the State OGS meetings, and accepted our 25 year certificate for the chapter and hoped we would plan a celebration for our 25th year anniversary.

Dale Neill, Echoes Editor, reported that the last issue was sent out 2 weeks ago. The next deadline is May 30 for the June issue. He had a first draft of the updated brochure for our society. When the last issue of Echoes was picked up at the printers, they had stapled them but we had not asked for them that way, so they printed 250 more issues. We had extra issues that went to the OGS Convention, Franklin County OGS, the Richwood-North Union Library, and a program at the YMCA that the library was involved with. We still have issues to pass out.

Don Degood, Membership Chair, asked if anyone had heard of a member not receiving their last Echoes issue, he had received one without the address. The list of non-renewed memberships is down to 18. He is still working on the September meeting.

Rev. Gray mentioned that he would be glad to help anyone with the surname of Gray/Grey. He has quite an extensive database on his computer that he has been collecting over the years.

It was also mentioned that if you are a member of the OGS, they have several online sources to use. Genealogy.Com, which is owned by Ancestry.com, is getting a lot of complaints of unethical practices, so beware.

Rev. Gray announced he would need to step down as our President in May as his wife, Patty, would be having surgery. He will need to be available to take care of her. Virginia Smith has agreed to serve as interim president. He said it had been a real privilege and he has thoroughly enjoyed working with all of us. January 1, 2006 he will be taking on the role as President of the Franklin County OGS. Virginia thanked Rev. Gray for serving as our president.

Ruth Stewart suggested that we purchase an item to commemorate our 25th year for the banquet. The group thought that was a good idea, but not enough time to get it done before the Pioneer Banquet. Don DeGood suggested we do something at the September meeting.

Don then introduced our speaker for the evening, Teresa Markam, Union County Recorder. He told the story of how she wanted a new 1877 Union County Atlas as the one in her office was in bad shape. So, he made a deal and said that if she would come and speak at our April meeting, she could have a copy. Her family surnames are Perkins, Hickok and Yoakam.

May 17, 2005

The Union County Chapter of the Ohio Genealogical Society held the Annual Pioneer Banquet at the Der Dutchman Restaurant in Plain City.

Vice President, Virginia Smith, welcomed everyone to our annual Pioneer Banquet and congratulated our society on being recognized for 25 years in existence. Rev. John Gray offered the blessing before our family style meal.

Ruth Bigelow Stewart, was honored with a Lifetime membership to the society. Her daughter, Nancy, told of her accomplishments with our chapter. She was one of our charter members, has served in different officer positions as secretary, president and vice president.

Pioneer chair person Karen Gwilliams, along with Julia Yoder and Linda Prosser, presented certificates to our newest pioneers. Mary Harrington Shumaker, of Pataskala, received a Gold certificate by proving two ancestors that lived here in Union County in 1831. They are Sarah Brake Shirk and Elizabeth Rice Harrington.

Erma Jane Ellinwood Ratterman, of Marion, received a Gold certificate by proving ancestor Joseph Murphy in 1840; and also Rebecca Greer Murphy in 1849, and David Murphy 1850 for a Silver certificate.

Linda Reed Prosser proved two ancestors each for a Gold and Silver certificates. Zephaniah Reed and Sidy Ann Cideann Amerine Reed were in the county 1833 for Gold. Alonzo Reed and Martha Burns Reed were in the county in 1850 for a Silver.

Penny Johnson Deibert of Columbus proved three silver ancestors. Lory Ford, Hesteran Ford and Mary Elizabeth Ford Johnson were in the county in 1850. We now have a total of 49 members who have

proved 217 pioneers living in the county before 1815. Karen encouraged everyone who was still working on their proofs to finish them and turn them in to be eligible for next year's banquet.

Don DeGood then introduced our speaker for the program, Jana Sloan Broglin. Jana gave an interesting presentation on different surnames found by genealogy researchers. Jana gave an entertaining program called "A Boy Named Sue". She told how unusual names could help you in the search of your ancestry and gave many examples of names she has run across in her research. Some people had surnames with colors, and sometimes their parents gave first names with a color, too. Other examples were surnames that were types of food. Some had the same first and last names, Some names referred to a part of the human body, or nature, or a famous book. In early Europe, occupations were used, instead of surnames. Sometimes there were errors in transcribing names, and you could find a person as a male in one census record and ten years later the name was transcribed as a female. She has run across some 'Just Plain Strange' names that makes you wonder 'What was Mom Thinking?'. The audience participated with examples of names.

Ruth Bigelow Stewart was born in 1922. She was born in her grandmother's house on West Fifth Street in Marysville, Ohio. She grew up on the Bigelow farm on St. Rt. 161, just outside of Plain City, Ohio. She went to Union Rural High School, which eventually became Fairbanks HS. She married Delbert Stewart in 1946 when she was 24. He was a farmer. They were married for 40 years. They had two children, Nancy and Melvin. She has two grandchildren by Nancy Katzenbach, Angela and Todd. Angela Beaver has one child, Noah. Ruth's hobbies have been sewing, quilting, and knitting. She has a collection of over 200 "Hen in the Nest" dishes.

Ruth's interest in genealogy began when she inherited the family history and old photos from the older folks in her family. Through her genealogy research, she has discovered that the Bigelow name was originally Baguley and came from England. The first Bigelow to come to Ohio was Rev. Issac Bigelow, and his son was a famous circuit rider minister, Rev. Russel Bigelow.

Ruth was very active in the Ladies Auxilliary of the Oddfellows, and at one time was State President of the Department of Association for the Ladies Auxilliary. She has received the highest award from the Oddfellows, the Decoration of Chivalry. She has held many offices in the Rebekah's Lodge, a department of the Ladies Auxilliary.

Ruth is a charter and founding member of the UCGS. She has held several offices in the UCGS. She was secretary in 1982 and 1983, president in 1984 and 1985, and vice-president in 1986 and 1987. Ruth copied and indexed the Union County Infirmery Registration, indexing every name and alphabetized them. The book was published in March of 1990. She helped organize the Union County Probate Court records in 1994. In 1997, she became a UCGS Gold Pioneer. In March of 1999, she gave a presentation on Union Township history. In 2000 she donated two books to the UCGS library collection: *The New Hampshire Marriage License and Intentions, 1709-1961* by Pauline Johnson Oesterlin, and *1785-1873 Narratives, Letters and Charts* by Lana Delong Davis. In 2001 she donated *The Bigelow Family Genealogy*, which is two volumes.

Today she continues to work on genealogy using her computer. Ruth was presented a lifetime membership for her dedication and at our Pioneer Banquet on May 17, 2005.

The Union County Genealogy Society is fortunate to have Ruth Stewart as a founding member.
