Julia, Mary & Marty will index genealogical material at Marysville Library. NEED genealogical material at Union County Historical Museum indexed!!

Wouldn't it be nice if the Marysville Library had a microfilm reader? They have a microfisch reader now.

Cemetery Records Committee hopes to have everything we know ready for the first break in the weather. All cemeteries (except Oakdale) will have to be done and those all ready done - rechecked to be sure we have the graves in proper position. Our list shows 41 cemeteries and we are on the track of several more!!

At our last meeting (Feb.) we voted to continue to answer all inquiries to the best of our abilities and with the materials we individually have. That if we had to check court house records, newspapers, libraries, etc., we would expect 20c/mile and a donation to our microfilm project of \$3.00 per hour. We are not professionals and the group felt that a fair deal all the way around. (Your President made a goof on one of the letters she answered and quoted \$20/mile - YIP!) In any case I have asked that each inquiry not have more than two questions - sound OK to you?

Every family researcher accumulates books, records, copies of records pertaining to their special interests. It is imperative that they be kept in an understandable order or file so that after death they do not get pitched. Do give some thought to your holdings & to including them in your will so that if they do not go to an interested family member they will be placed in the Marysville Library for safe keeping & use by fellow researchers. When I first heard about the JENKS Genealogy published by the estate of Harlan walker Jenks - I was crushed. This

man had spent his life time researching the Jenks ancestry in the U.S. and England. He left his estate for the publishing of his collection. A distant relative cleaned out his apartment & pitched everything: The estate had to hire professionals on both sides of the Atlantic to try & reconstruct his research - a long drawn out process starting from scratch. They never did find everything that he had located wars & fires had destroyed some - dampness & mice made other records unreadable. Do give this topic your best THINK:
