

Memorials for the recently deceased

When adding memorials for the recently deceased, if you are not a family member and it is too soon for the burial information to be known, please wait until it is known to create the memorial.

When adding a memorial for a recently deceased person (within the past year), the form will ask if you are related, select Yes, and choose your relationship. When adding your relationship, you can decide to make it <u>public or private</u> using the checkbox "Show relationship in the source information." If related within their updated transfer guidelines, found under <u>Request to Manage</u>, the memorial is added traditionally and managed by the close relative.

Member is not related, following the updated transfer guidelines. Be sensitive to family members, as the memorial displays limited information to others on the site





for the first three months after the death date. After three months from the death date, the view of the memorial is no longer limited. The memorial will show as others do, except that for up to a year from the death date, the option for a close relative to 'Manage' the memorial will show on the memorial.

Here is an example of what a memorial for a recently deceased person looks like in a search list (for everyone except the manager):



Are you a close relative of James?

The manager's view of the memorial is the same as any other memorial they manage.

Managing a close relative's memorial

During those first three months after the death date (when the memorial displays with a limited view), they have added a simple way for close relatives to request to manage the memorial. A close relative can click the 'Manage' button, add their relationship, and become the manager for a new memorial for that person. The option to 'Manage' can be found on the memorial and in memorial lists. Since the manager is related, the memorial will display and act as any other memorial. You can choose to make your relationship <u>public or private</u>.

To request to manage a memorial for someone you are related to (within our updated transfer guidelines) who has died in the past year, select 'Manage' and go through the process to become the memorial manager.

Adding Your Relationship to Memorials You Manage

Relationship information helps Find-a-Grave make decisions about merges, transfer requests, and memorials for the recently deceased. To add your relationship to an existing monument that you manage, select Edit, scroll down, and choose your relationship.

You can choose to make your relationship public or private. If you decide to keep your relationship private, nothing will be displayed next to your profile name for other members, but you will note that your relationship is private.





Roger Minert - Cemeteries in Central Europe

The presenter demonstrates how the individual or family grave and appearance are of great concern to Europeans - the question of death and burial records--often asked by North American researchers--are also discussed in detail. This updated presentation was during Prof. Minert's recent stay in Frankfurt am Main, Germany.





Old Bowling Alley Wood Used to Help Build Saxbe Homes

Marysville is well-represented in the new Mechanicsburg home of U.S. senatorial candidate of **Bill Saxbe.**

Much of the lumber used in the **Saxbe** family's new residence formerly saw service in the Marysville Bowling Alleys located in the basement of the present Kroger store. According to Ernie Smith, one of the operators of the former recreation spot, lumber from the

alleys was first sold to an Irwin man. Saxbe later purchased it to minimize building costs. Present Speaker of the Ohio House of Representatives, **Saxbe**, opposes **George Bender** for

the Republican nomination as U.S. Senator.

Mr. and Mrs. Grigg, experienced funeral directors, will take possession of the property and business on or about November 1. The Griggs have a son, **Garey**, aged seven.

Mr. and Mrs. Reed founded the funeral home in Milford Center thirteen years ago after moving from Xenia, and for eight years, Mr. Reed also conducted a furniture store and his funeral home. The Reeds have announced no immediate plans for the future.

Elden Grigg took over the funeral home in 1950 and changed the name to Grigg Funeral Home in 1952

Eldon Grigg and his family will soon leave Milford Center to make their home in Lima. **Eldon** will work for the Siferd Funeral Home there. His wife **Ann** and daughter will remain in Milford Center until school is out. Their son, **Gary**, is a student in Urbana Junior College.

Eldon Grigg was related to **Charles C. Siferd**, who opened Siferd Funeral Home in 1913 in Lima, Ohio.

After 1962, the house was converted into a private residence. The house at 47 S Mill is still there. The current condition of the house in 2022 is beyond repair and empty.

Editor's Note: **Karen Sayre**, an UCCOGS member, asked where the Reed Funeral Home was. To my surprise, it was in the same block my in-laws lived in, and my husband grew up. Thanks, Karen, for needing this information we found on death certificates and contributing to the newsletter.

My sister-in-law, **Debbie Scott**, remembers when the **Roberts** lived there with five children. She spent nights sleeping overnight, and the kids told ghost stories. **Debbie** could sleep thru anything as she grew up by the railroad tracks.
