In October of 1993, Marge Waterfield of Bowling Green spoke on petitions to partition an estate and gave us another idea to try when Probate Court records do not have anything in will or estate files pertaining to our particular family.

In Ohio, petitions to partition an estate were filed in the Common Pleas Courts, and could be listed under a sheriff's name if a sale was necessary to divide an estate among eligible heirs; eventually this land record would show up in the recorder's office, again not filed under the name of the original owner. The petition could also be filed by the holder of the mortgage who wanted to clear his claim.

This can be a difficult search as the partitions cases are not indexed separately from othe common pleas cases and can be filed (cont. next page).

under names not in the family of the land owner. Occasionally someone outside the court system has indexed the cases or they may have been microfilmed. A successful search can be most helpful to the researcher, as all the heirs are named, with relationships, guardians for minors, widow's name is listed for her dower, even if remarried.

In September, Mrs. Julia Overton, of Yellow Springs, gave another fact-packed presentation, and provided a handout for the resources to be found in the Greene County Room at the Xenia Public Library. She explained that following the Revolutionary War, with its few official records, pension applicants had varying rules to follow as time passed after the end of the war, and the U. S. Congress finally provided pensions for aging veterans.

The value to the veterans' descendants is the amount of data the veteran or his heirs provided regarding both the service and proof of identity of the serviceman. Sometimes priceless original documents were forwarded to the government; marriage papers, Bible pages, etc.

Some of these applications are printed in the Ohio Genealogical Society publication, OHIO RECORDS AND PIONEER FAMILIES. Pension papers may be requested from the National Archives where their personnel choose the pages from the file to be copied and forwarded; sometimes these are not the ones most useful to the genealogist. Recommended was the INDEX OF REVOLUTIONARY WAR PENSION APPLICATIONS IN THE NATIONAL ARCHIVES (Washington D. C. National Genealogy Society 1976) as a key to using the National Archives Series M804 microfilmed records of these pension applications. The entire file was microfilmed and the film may be borrowed through a library for a fee. Files were kept even when the pension request was rejected and may contain additional information as the veteran or heir tried repeatedly.]

Better records were kept for later wars. For Ohio soldiers in the Civil War, there is a set of 12 books of rosters (most available at Marysville also) and at Xenia there is an index for that set. Pensions were available much nearer the end of the Civil War, so many more applicants were still living and by that time the necessary proofs were easier to obtain. The War with Mexico (1836-1848) had many serving from Southern military. Ohio National Guard participated in the Spanish-American War. WWI records are still listed under the "right to know" basis, as some veterans still survive.
